# RESUME Nancy M. Kelly, B.S., CPDT-KA Certified Professional Dog Trainer Behavior Consultant

## Writing and Teaching

**2018**: Edited the re-publication of *Animal Behavior* by Keller and Marian Breland, assisting Dr. Bob Bailey in this project. We assembled a small team including a couple of editors and a publisher to get this classic book re-released with the addition of over 50 pages of historic photos, a new introduction and foreword by Dr. Bailey, keeping the exact words of the original authors in the main text. The original book, published in 1966, is out of print and now available only at a very high price to those who want to read it. The new book brings it back into the world of science-based animal training so everyone can have access. I'm proud to have been a part of this project.

**2018**: Wrote a new training manual for training foster dogs inside a facility that houses and rehabilitates troubled adolescent girls. Training program focus was on teaching staff to manage and interact appropriately with dogs, teaching residents to train and groom dogs as potential vocations, and teaching all participants to use best handling practices to produce high-quality pet dogs that are easily adopted and fare well in a family environment. Additional emphasis was on training some of the dogs to participate in therapy sessions with the residents.

**2018**: Conducted workshops in conjunction with the training program above, preparing staff for bringing dogs onto the site. Workshops included Reading Dogs, Low-stress Handling for Grooming and Husbandry (both lecture and hands-on practice), Emergency Response, Preventing Bad Associations for Dogs, and Introduction to Animal Training (lecture and hands-on practice). I conducted additional training classes and workshops for residents and staff to work together with the dogs in preparation for managing dogs on site on a daily basis.

**2017**: Created and taught Leashwork Workshop to trainers, approved for CEUs by CCPDT (Certification Council for Pet Dog Trainers). 2 hours of lecture and 2 hours of hands-on practice with dogs not familiar to students, teaching how to apply behavior principles to training dogs and teaching humans, mechanical skills in reinforcement, creating training plans, and isolating individual skills for development in both dogs and humans.

**2016 – 2017**: Created and taught Introduction to Animal Training Workshop to trainers, approved for CEUs by CCPDT. 2 hours of lecture on historic and academic foundations for animal training including Pavlov, Skinner, Herrnstein and other pioneers; behavior terminology, planning, shaping and recordkeeping. 2 hours of hands-on practice, people training people using a portable operant conditioning lab system. Structured team coaching and observation practice of skills including placement and speed of reinforcement with and without clickers, training a behavior using a plan with feedback from an observer, and putting behaviors on cue.

**2016**: Wrote and published a service dog training manual which was subsequently customized and licensed for three unrelated individual service dog training organizations. Complete training program with emphasis on behavior principles, planning and documentation, and uniform training procedures among trainers and handlers. Includes specific protocols and schedules with focus on training efficiently and effectively with science-based positive reinforcement training.

# **Training Positions**

**2019 - Present**: Independent Dog Training Business Owner (The Mannerly Dog): Business focus on small, highly productive, face-to-face training classes, using a variety of curricula. Puppy Life Skills class, Basic Manners class, Advanced/CGC Prep class, and Training in the Details class all based on scientific behavior principles to train dogs and humans efficiently and effectively. I managed two assistant trainers, and together we documented the progress in learning of many owners and dogs. In early 2020, because of the COVID-19 pandemic, I transformed the class structure to a virtual format and continued teaching Basic Manners and then added Training in the Details advanced class, with great success. The virtual format requires less time and produces extensive learning in students and dogs while including even more individual behaviors in the curriculum.

1990 - 2018: Independent Dog Training Business Owner (The Mannerly Dog): Until 2019, I saw clients on an individual basis to teach basic dog manners, competition behaviors, and service dog training. I conducted public access tests for service and therapy dogs, assisted clients in modifying behavior for "behavior cases," including aggression, fear, and more. I evaluated dogs, wrote training plans and reports, and consulted on behavior with pet-sitting services, rescue groups, shelters, and veterinary clinics. I have worked with some hundreds of dogs and their owners over the years, in addition to many unowned shelter dogs, shelter staff, rescue volunteers and other dog handlers. I taught interns, trained service dogs, and helped owners solve a variety of behavior problems as well as teaching dog owners to use sound positive reinforcement based behavior science to train their pets.

**2000** – **Present:** Behavior Consultant with English Springer Rescue America; I consult on behavior issues in several states using video, phone conversations, email, and sometimes in-person visits to gather information necessary for using standard procedures to evaluate foster dogs showing aggression, fear, and other behavior issues, working on teams to plan outcomes for these dogs. In the process, I teach regional coordinators to refer to results and conclusions of research available to them to allow a logical assessment process. As of **2020**, I have succeeded in getting some training in dog behavior implemented for volunteers in this nationwide organization, with an eye toward providing further training in handling best practices, management, and behavior modification basics in the future.

**2015 – Present**: Behavior consultant for BARC Animal Shelter & Adoptions in Houston, Texas I continue to consult on behavior topics with staff and management at BARC as needed.

**2014 – 2015:** Behavior Specialist for BARC Animal Shelter & Adoptions in Houston, Texas. I developed a behavior program focused on teaching staff to use best practices in animal handling to reduce animal stress and increase handler and animal safety and taught classes and workshops to implement the program, which is still in use. I wrote protocols and curricula as well as a handling policy for this large open-intake shelter (27,000+ animals per year). I taught about 40 animal caretakers, veterinary technicians, and animal control officers in multiple handling and behavior classes to reduce bite incidents and shelter animal stress. I taught about 200 adopters with their dogs in group classes and individual consultations, consulted with foster and rescue group volunteers, and trained and assisted about 100 shelter volunteers in proper animal handling techniques. I trained hundreds of shelter dogs and cats and wrote hundreds of reports on behavioral observations and evaluations.

**2016 – 2018**: Training Coordinator and Trainer for Give Us Paws, a not for profit service dog training organization: worked with about 10 individual handlers and their dogs. I trained about 15 trainers in the organization's training program (which I developed – see 2016 – service dog training manual,

above). I trained trainers in other behavioral and training topics to help them improve their skills. I researched and developed an evaluation procedure for potential service dogs and taught it to other trainers. I conducted and wrote reports on evaluations of potential service dog candidates, consulted with other trainers encountering challenges in their training, and taught clients to train their own service dogs.

### **Education and Titles**

**January, 2020**: Started attending classes to fulfill the requirements of Master's degree in Psychology/Behavior Analysis at University of Houston - Clear Lake.

**November, 2011**: Earned CPDT-KA certification, certificate number 2112795. Criteria included 500 hours of training over 5 years, recommendation by a veterinarian and a training colleague, and a qualifying score on a 4 hour comprehensive test on dog husbandry, behavior, management, and training.

**2001 – 2013**: I participated in all of Dr. Bob Bailey's Operant Condition Workshops, some of them twice. I travelled to Hot Springs, Arkansas; Borlange, Sweden; and Columbia, Maryland to study for over 300 hours with Dr. Bailey.
